Benefits of Word Prediction

Word prediction software like WordQ can provide several advantages:

- Improved spelling accuracy: Studies have shown that word prediction can significantly reduce spelling errors
- Increased writing fluency: Some research indicates that word prediction can help increase the rate
 of text production
- Reduced keystrokes: Word prediction typically reduces the number of keystrokes needed to type words,
- Enhanced vocabulary use: Word prediction may encourage users to employ a wider variety of words
- Improved confidence and independence: Many users report feeling more confident in their writing abilities



Considerations for Use

- **Training and practice**: Users, teachers and support staff often require time and practice to become proficient with word prediction software
- **Customisation**: WordQ allows for customization of topic-specific vocabularies, which can enhance their effectiveness for specific tasks or subjects
- Combination with other tools: Research suggests that combining word prediction with other assistive technologies, such as text-to-speech, can lead to even greater benefits for some users
- Individual assessment: Given the variability in outcomes, it's important to assess the effectiveness of word prediction software on an individual basis


Normalising Assistive Technology

Positive impact of WordQ on the user

- WordQ isn't just for Special Needs users e.g. users include those where English is not their first language
- When all can use and benefit from AT the stigma is removed
- It empowers individuals
- Users become independent learners Teachers can invest time with the rest of the class
- Builds confidence and self-esteem
- Improves user wellbeing
- Less energy is used with words predicted within 2 keystrokes
